Understanding the Assignment

The task at hand for the intercessor in times of challenge and change.



Today's world leaves no question that there is a need for prayer. The very events that Jesus gave us the preview of in scripture are happening right before our eyes and "as it was in the days of Noah" is all around us. This is not the world that we or our parents, much less grandparents experienced or even imagined but here we are.
